



Dockers and small boat users;

The sailing season is winding down as fall weather encroaches. You may be contemplating plans for pulling your boat and its winter storage. To that end I provide some direction that will minimize chaos on the grounds of the MYC.

- Docks will tentatively be pulled on October 27. Please remove your boat well in advance of this date, preferably by the prior weekend (October 20-21). *Don't procrastinate...*
- Docks will be placed as usual near the area where small boats are presently stored and near the ramp, so we will need to keep this area clear as the removal date approaches.
- If you will not be keeping your boat on the grounds this winter, it would be helpful for you to remove it from the grounds as soon as possible. You may store it temporarily near the NW corner of the property while you prepare it for transport, but please keep this period brief (a couple days max), and do not block the area reserved for dock storage or for the movement of other boats.
- If you will be keeping your boat on the grounds this winter, please contact me and I will advise you on where to place it. In brief, we will be placing larger boats for winter storage where they were last winter on the grass in a parallel parking type pattern near the clubhouse. Small boats may remain on racks, or boats on trailers may be moved onto the grass to provide more area near the congested NW corner of the property.
- Reminder: Trailers on premises (even for short periods) must have owners name on tongue, and small boats left for winter must be registered with a numbered MYC sticker on transom (obtained from Dock Committee).
